Introduction:

Te Runanga o NgaiTakoto scholarships were formed in 2012. The overall aim of NgaiTakoto Scholarships is to assist NgaiTakoto beneficiaries to fulfil their potential for academic success, and encourage applicants to contribute their skills towards the wellbeing and betterment of NgaiTakoto whanau, hapu and Iwi.

Scholarships are available to all students of NgaiTakoto descent who are formally enrolled in a approved university/polytechnic/institute of technology/Wananga/private training establishment and registered with Te Runanga o NgaiTakoto.

Scholarship Criteria:

To be eligible all applicants must fulfil the following criteria:

- ❖ Be registered to Te Runanga o NgaiTakoto a 6month standdown period for new registrations applies.
- ❖ Must complete all compulsory sections of this form and sign the Declaration.
- Provide all required documentation.

Te Runanga o NgaiTakoto Scholarship Policy:

The purpose of the NgaiTakoto Scholarship Policy is to ensure that there is a criterion framework, which ensures consistency in the processes of scholarship administration, decision-making, and scholarship disbursement. It also ensures that good practice principles of fairness, clarity, and transparency are embedded through each section of the scholarship process.

NgaiTakoto Scholarship selection and disbursement are underpinned by Te Runanga o NgaiTakoto Strategic directions, which are encapsulated within its Strategic Plan.

NgaiTakoto Scholarship Availability:

Te Runanga o NgaiTakoto offers Seven Core specific Board Scholarships recognising and honouring our Tupuna who from the onset of the claim have been the driving force for the Iwi.

- 1. Rev. Bert Karaka Pursuit of Industry & Construction
- 2. Rev. Maori Marsden Pursuit of Wananga & Theological Studies
- 3. Rev. Harold Petera Pursuit of Agriculture & Horticulture
- 4. Te Rari (Laddie) & Hariamai Cook Pursuit of Marine & Environmental Studies
- 5. Hiraina Marsden Pursuit of Creative Arts
- 6. Walter Erstich Pursuit of Matauranga Maori
- 7. Lance (Jeb) Brown Pursuit of Law & Justice

Te Runanga o NgaiTakoto also has the ability to distribute further Scholarships funding to NgaiTakoto beneficiaries on behalf of their marae registration for those seeking studies in the following Qualifications.

<u>Certificates:</u> can be used to help you prepare for either employment or further study and training, and usually take a year to complete.

<u>Diploma</u> normally requires two years of full-time study, though you can sometimes complete the qualification through part-time study. It can follow on from a certificate, or can be a stand-alone qualification.

Bachelors Degree: is an undergraduate degree that normally requires at least three years of full-time study. You can often study part time over a number of years.

<u>Bachelor's degree with Honours:</u> is either a one-year programme after a three-year Bachelor's degree, or a longer four-year Bachelor's degree that requires a particular level of achievement.

<u>Postgraduate diplomas or certificates</u>: are open to graduates (those who have a Bachelor's degree), and usually take one year. For example, a secondary school teacher may complete a Postgraduate Diploma of Teaching, after completing a degree in their teaching subject.

<u>Masters Degree:</u> is an advanced degree taken by someone who already holds a Bachelor's degree or, in some cases, has extensive experience in the relevant field. It usually involves writing a piece based on focused research, called a thesis. Most Masters degrees take two years of full-time study to complete, or four years part-time.

<u>Doctorate:</u> also called a PhD, and is the highest university degree. It usually involves extensive research resulting in a thesis, and will earn you the title of Doctor. Most PhDs take three years of full-time study.



Te Runanga o NgaiTakoto Scholarship Application Process:

- 1. Applications are vetted to ensure eligibility criteria are met.
- 2. All applications will receive notification of application receipt, and/or if applicable, requests for further information from Te Runanga o NgaiTakoto.
- 3. Applications in each category are considered in line with the appropriateness of the study programme to the Strategic Goals of Te Runanga o NgaiTakoto with preference being given to those applicants whose work includes:
 - A demonstrable transfer of skills and/or learning to programmes directly beneficial to NgaiTakoto
 - Areas of study which are highly desirable to NgaiTakoto
 - Aspects of research and study that promote and encourage the sustainability and maintenance of our Whenua and Moana
 - Aspects of research and study that promote the growth and understandings of NgaiTakoto
 - Applicant's prior academic coursework and marks, where applicable, will be taken into consideration.

Te Runanga o NgaiTakoto Scholarship Recipient:

All successful recipients will be notified of the appropriate disbursement by the 20th January in any given year. Although successful recipients are not bonded to Te Runanga o NgaiTakoto, you are expected to fulfil your agreement obligations by:

- Providing a copy of your end of year results following your award, and /or
- > Submitting a copy of any studies you wish to undertake, to the Runanga, if applicable.
- > Upon completing studies, all students are required to submit a brief report and provide proof of evidence of successful completion, Failure to do so will result in funding being declined
- Applications for funding are one off (per person).
- Scholarships are reimbursed to recipients or training organisations on proof of Study outcomes being completed.
- > Student's loans will also be reimbursed for that particular study on proof of completion and pass.

Amounts Available for NgaiTakoto Scholarships:

NgaiTakoto Scholarship amounts are to a maximum of \$5,000.00

If there are insufficient eligible applications for specific levels disbursement, then those funds at the discretion of the NgaiTakoto Scholarships Selection Committee can be allocated to other areas of academic engagement. Unused amounts do not accrue over subsequent years.

Re-application Information:

If a scholarship application is not successful applicants may re-apply in the following year.

PLEASE READ:

Students enrolled in FREE courses or who have received a scholarship for their intended studies are in-eligible to apply for a NgaiTakoto scholarship.

All full-time employees of Te Runanga o NgaiTakoto are in-eligible to apply for a NgaiTakoto scholarships.

The applications will be considered by a Panel appointed by The Board of Te Runanga o NgaiTakoto whose decisions will be final and binding. No correspondence will be entered into on these matters.


