

A LOOK AT OUR SIGNIFICANT SITES

Puke Ngātu Pā sits directly across from Lake Ngātu and is said to be where tūpāpaku were brought to lay after the Battle of Rangi Aniwaniwa that involved Whiti. They were washed in Lake Ngātu before being laid to rest in Ngāi Takoto or traveling back up Te Oneroa a Tohe to Te Aupōuri. Puke meaning hill and Ngātu after our roto below.

The Rākau Ora kaimahi delivered out freshly harvested avocados and also carrots plus potatoes thanks to Wilcox who also know that our whenua grows good kai. Many schools, kindergartens, marae, organisations and whānau were able to reap these rewards.





Taiao Ngāi Takoto worked in collaboration with Bushlands Trust, Summit Forests and Paparore School to plant over 1400 native trees around Lake Ngātu. Native tree planting is a great kaitiakitanga practice in improving dune lake systems and water quality by acting as a filter that protects the area from catchment.
